AZIZA HASAN (NEW GROUND, LOS ANGELES)

Aziza Hasan is an alumna of Bethel College (2003) and Wichita State University (2011). From 2003-2005, she served two years as a volunteer with Interfaith Ministries of Wichita for AmeriCorps. Named an influencer by the Chronicle of Philanthropy, she is co-founder and the executive director of *New Ground: A Muslim-Jewish Partnership for Change*. As accomplished mediator and conflict transformation practitioner, Aziza's work has been featured on National Public Radio (NPR), MSN, United States Institute for Peace, and the Los Angeles Times. In 2006, she earned the "President's Volunteer Service Award" under President George W. Bush. From 2015-2016, Aziza served on President Obama's 3rd Advisory Council on Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships. She contributes to the Los Angeles Civil and Human Rights Commission. Her publications include "The Power of Relationships and Personal Story in Transforming Community" in the Journal of Inter-Religious Studies of the Harvard Pluralism Project (2015). She is co-author of "Interfaith Curriculum for Peacemaking" (August 2012) and "Standing Together: Interfaith Dialogue Curriculum for Muslims and Christians" (2010); she also authored "More Alike Than Different," Inter-Faith Ministries Kansas (1999).
