The Global Peace/ Stop Violence Academy (GPSVA)

Dr. Akiiki Daisy Kabagarama

In this presentation, Dr. Akiiki Daisy Kabagarama introduces a Peace Academy for teaching peace and curbing violence through the Ubuntu (Human Essence) principles. Her book “Breaking the Ice: A guide to Understanding People from Other Cultures” is the primary text for the Academy. She knows first-hand, the wounds of violence that run deep. Her own grandmother lost an entire family in battle.

Award-winning teacher and author, Dr. Akiiki Daisy Kabagarama is a native of Uganda. Her undergraduate education in Social work and Administration was obtained from Makerere University, Uganda. In 1982, she enrolled at Iowa State University from where she obtained a Master of Community and Regional Planning and a Doctorate in Sociology. Her theological education is from Wesley Theological Seminary.

Dr. Kabagarama’s many years of teaching include: Sociology at McPherson College; Minority/Ethnic Studies, Dealing with Diversity and Women’s Studies at Wichita State University; Philosophy at Friends and Newman Universities plus Psychology and Sociology at Butler Community College. She also served as an Interim Director of the Global Learning Center for one summer.

Among her many community-service awards, Dr. Kabagarama received the “Promotion of International Peace and Friendship” award from Iowa State University. She is a poet, story teller and drummer, which skills she applies to her work. For two years, she co-hosted a Diversity program on the Kansas Public Television Station (KPTS) and is currently a host of the show “A Light from the Nile” on KSUN Community Radio Station. She is also the Founder and current President of the Wichita African Union.
