**U.S./El Salvador Sister Cities
 Wichita FOCUS Central America**

The 12-year civil war in El Salvador left much of the population forced from their land and almost the entire populations of some villages massacred. El Salvador was and still is one of the poorest and most violent countries in the Americas. Recovery is a long, hard battle.

U.S./El Salvador Sister Cities stepped in to help the displaced, struggling people. A small group of Wichitans (FOCUS) joined with this group to offer financial aid, moral support, accompaniment aid, and election observation. Education, metallic mining and its accompanying water pollution, possible water privatization are just some of the problems facing communities. Now with Temporary Protective Status (TPS) granted to Salvadorians possibly being ended by the United States, more problems may be added to the struggle.
